National Museum of Australia

At the National Museum of Australia every object tells a story about Australia and Australians. Each of these stories provides a unique educational tool, enabling teachers to encourage students to make the important links between their historical and contemporary environments. Facilitated Education programs help students uncover these stories through handling of objects and dynamic, engaging gallery activities

11.30am A living Culture

A Living Culture is a Museum Educator facilitated program which introduces students to the diversity of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, culture and life in Australia. Students use a range of objects to help understand Indigenous cultures and how they have evolved and adapted since 1788. Older students discuss and analyse the two vastly different cultures that collided upon the arrival of Europeans, and the impact this has had on Indigenous Australians. Teachers are then encouraged to further explore the galleries with their students.
